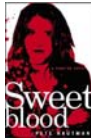
**CORM**

 by Margaret Mahy, 1984

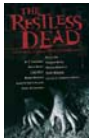
When her baby brother seems to become possessed by an evil spirit, Laura seeks the help of an older boy at school who she is convinced has supernatural powers.

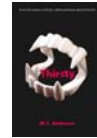
